Local Life - Street Eat by Tuk Tuk - Bangkok *\$146.00 for couple*

Experience Bangkok at its tastiest with a unique four-hour food tour under the stars. Buzz through bustling Bangkok streets on a tuk-tuk to arrive at Bangkok locals' favorite food haunts and taste the best of Thai cooking. Do it all under the cover of darkness in the hours leading up to midnight to experience a truly magical side of the city.

Phi Phi Island (by Speed Boat) - Phuket *\$262.00 for couple*

Spend your day basking in the sun with this day-long speedboat excursion. Depart from your Phuket hotel in the morning and board a boat to Koh Phi Phi, the very definition of paradise. Jet between Koh Phi Phi's two main islands, Phi Phi Don and Phi Phi Lay, and spend the day exploring the breathtaking scenery on land and underwater, from fine sandy beaches to soaring limestone cliffs. Opt to visit the smaller, uninhabited island of Phi Phi Leh, where limestone walls, caves, blue-green lagoons and coral gardens are a snorkeler's paradise. You can also visit Maya Bay, a sensational beach used as a location for the Hollywood film *The Beach*. After a full day of relaxing, snorkeling, swimming and sunbathing, head back by speedboat to Phuket for your evening

City and Temples Tour - Bangkok *\$96.00 for couple*

Explore Bangkok's history and heritage on a group or private, half-day guided tour that takes in the city's finest temples. Step into the hushed grandeur of Wat Pho and light a candle beside the massive reclining Buddha, then stroll between the distinctive chedis built for four Chakri kings. Take in the architectural grace of Wat Benchamabophit, a marble temple with ornately stepped-out roofs, then discover the treasure inside Wat Trimitr, where a gleaming Buddha sits lotus style, weighed down by 5.5tons (5 tonnes) of solid gold.

Damnoen Saduak Floating Market & River Kwai Tour - Bangkok \$314 for couple

Start this busy day with an early morning departure with your guide, heading for the province of Ratchaburi around 100 kilometers southwest of Bangkok. This quaint old province is home to one of the most famous floating markets in the country, Damnoen Saduak, and there's ample time to explore the network of canals via traditional longtail boat. You can also walk around, taking in the vibrant sights, sounds, and smells, as well as bargaining for some souvenirs or indulging in some local delicacies. After your shopping and culture fix, say goodbye to Ratchaburi and head north on the road to Kanchanaburi, home to the world-famous 'Bridge over the River Kwai' that was built during the Second World War. Take your time to explore this iconic structure, together with the nearby war museum that gives an excellent insight into the horrors that unfolded during the bridge's construction. The tracks are still in use today; board the train at Nam Tok Station and ride along the notorious 'death railway' yourself, passing through the jungles and along a heart-stopping cliff overlooking the river. Afterwards, there's time to visit the poignant War Cemetery, containing the remains of 6,982 allied prisoners of the war, most of whom lost their lives during the construction of the bridge and rail route stretching to Burma.

Elephants at Work Chiang Dao w/Riding & Rafting - Chiang Mai \$250.00 for couple

Depart Chiang Mai for an area of jungle located around 60 kilometres away from the city, known as Chiang Dao. This area is home to the national animal of Thailand - the mighty elephant - roaming around designated areas. Watch as the elephants demonstrate their incredible power and intelligence in shows that showcase, but never over-exert, these magnificent animals.

After the educational demonstrations, get up-close and personal with the elephants with a short ride across a river and through the jungle. Unlike other elephant camps in the country, Chiang Dao offers you the chance to see the animals in their natural environment, and it has also been praised for efforts in promoting eco-tourism and elephant conservation. Afterwards, continue to the nearby Ping River, and enjoy bamboo rafting as well as lunch at a local restaurant. On the way back to Chiang Mai, stop off to stretch your legs with a visit to an orchid farm.

Wat Phra That Doi Suthep Tour - \$102.00 for couple

Today, head half-way up Doi Suthep - the mountain that towers over the city of Chiang Mai - to find the highly-revered Wat Phra That Doi Suthep. A visit here is an absolute must for first-time visitors, and part of the allure is in the journey getting here. Make the exciting drive up along the long and winding road to enjoy a surprisingly cooling of the surrounding air as you ascend.

Arrive at the temple and leave the car behind to start the walk up to the top. Opt to conquer the 300 steps, or swap two feet for a cable car instead. At the top, explore the central chedi adorned in golden flakes, renowned for its glittering facade under the mid-day sun. The architecture, statues, murals and shrines seen here are nothing short of breathtaking and promise commanding views over the surrounding wilderness. If they are active clients, they can do a bike tour in the afternoon for a few hours

Phuket Thai Cookery School - Phuket \$242.00 for couple
